Organizing your Medicine Cabinet

Instead of rummaging through your Medicine Cabinet in an emergency, you may want to take a few minutes and organize your medicine cabinet.

I find that it's helpful to have a few small baskets on hand or a few shoe boxes. These will help you corral your items.

Once you've emptied the cabinet. Place your items into categories that make sense for your family – use daily, use as needed, etc.

Use as needed – cough medicine, allergy, acetaminophen, and ibuprofen

Basket for Band-Aids, sprains,

Basket for ointments

Eye care

First Aid items

Hot water bottle and gel packs

Extra toiletries and hygiene products

If you take care of someone who takes a lot of medication, create a master medication list. You should document what the medication is and the dosage and when the person started taking it and it's a good idea to date the document. This can be helpful at the next upcoming doctor's appointment.
